



## **MGT 310 – Threat & Risk Assessment**

### **16 Hours**

This course prepares emergency response managers, community leaders, private sector, non-government organizations, and tribal leaders to conduct a comprehensive, capabilities-based threat and risk assessment for a terrorism/all-hazards incident under the National Response Framework (NRF), National Preparedness Guidelines and Homeland Security Presidential Directives. Participant activities focus on the jurisdictional process for determining the ability to respond, to chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, and explosive (CBRNE) and all-hazards events and the development of the needs assessment to fill shortfalls/gaps identified within the solution areas. The course delivery combines lecture, small group discussions, participant activities, and multimedia scenarios to improve the multi disciplinary emergency team's capability to prevent, protect, respond to, or recover from CBRNE/all-hazards mass casualty events. MGT-310 is taught at your jurisdiction and is delivered at no cost.
